Fairborn Police Department

Requests for police action regarding a specific problem should be submitted directly to the Fairborn Police Department. Such requests could relate to a complaint about a police employee or procedure.

COMMUNITY SAFETY CHECKLIST

- Call 9-1-1 only for emergency situations. For non-emergency situations, call the Police Dispatcher at 754-3000.
- When calling 9-1-1, remain as calm as possible so you can provide accurate information to the Police Dispatcher.
- Attempt to meet your neighbors and co-workers.
- Be aware of your surroundings. Report suspicious acts and unusual situations to authorities.
- The curfew for children 14 years old and under is 10:00 p.m. and 11:00 p.m. for children 15 to 17 years old. Instruct your children accordingly.
- Jog or walk with a friend, especially after dark.
- At night, use an outside porch light if a lamp post is not located near your house.
- Keep shrubbery trimmed away from windows and the entry ways to your home.
- If you park your vehicle outside, remove all valuables then secure and lock the vehicle.
- Notify the Police Department if you notice vehicles that appear to be abandoned or suspicious.
- Use Direct Deposit if possible for payroll and benefit checks.
- Never give personal information over the phone or e-mail.
- Shred all documents containing personal information before discarding them.
- Avoid phone/mail/e-mail scams. If it seems too good to be true — it probably is!
- Support drug awareness programs such as DARE.
